**International and Regional Migration among Skilled Professionals**

**Abstract:**

Analysis of recent arrivals data for selected professionals migrating to Australia highlights the role of serial migration. Playing an important role in this process are Hong Kong and Singapore which constitute regional hubs for those individuals who subsequently move to Australia. The paper then considers the role of national and commercial economic strategies, international education and career mobility in the development of these patterns prior to discussing the impact of differential modes of institutional globalisation
